CONSUMER INFORMATION FOR PROSPECTIVE AND CURRENT GW STUDENTS, FACULTY AND STAFF

The Higher Education Act (HEA), as amended by the Higher Education Opportunity Act of 2008 (HEOA) requires all colleges and universities to make an annual, direct disclosure to all prospective and current students, faculty, and staff of the availability of information on student financial assistance and other disclosures relating to institutional operations. Unless a direct disclosure is specifically required, George Washington University disclosures are provided through institutional student consumer information such as specific websites and the University Bulletin.
