



Overview of the Tuition Exchange Program

[Tuition Exchange](#) (TE) is a reciprocal scholarship opportunity for eligible faculty and staff dependents at all [700+ individual TE member schools](#). TE Scholarships are available to eligible employees and qualifying dependents at TE member schools.

GW offers a new value of Tuition Exchange funding for each cohort enrolling at the university. The Tuition Exchange Scholarship amount for students entering GW in 2025-2026 is set at \$56,000 or about 80% of the cost of tuition. For this cohort of students, they will receive the same amount of Tuition Exchange Scholarship funding each year as long as they are enrolled full time each semester (12 or more credit hours) and maintain an overall 2.0 GPA or better. This scholarship is offered for a maximum of 8 semesters.

Types of Students

Export = (sending out) a George Washington University dependent receiving tuition exchange at another TE school

Import = (bringing in) a non-GW employee dependent receiving tuition exchange at GWU

Who is Eligible for Tuition Exchange?

GW employees in benefits-eligible positions (e.g., Full-Time, Part-Time) with more than four (4) years of continuous service at the university. The TE scholarship covers only undergraduate degrees for dependent children of GW employees and up to four (4) years or eight (8) semesters. The TE scholarship does not cover graduate programs.

Things to Know

Tuition Exchange Scholarships are not guaranteed and selectivity varies by school. Families should do their research prior to applying for Tuition Exchange. Students may add up to 20 schools to their Tuition Exchange application.

The value of the TE scholarship is full tuition for the annual TE set rate or a custom rate that individual schools may choose. The set rate is \$43,000 for 2025-2026; so, schools at minimum offer that amount for TE. Students should check with schools they are applying to for details regarding the offered TE scholarship amount and details.

Application Process

1. During your Junior/Senior year select your schools of interest
2. Apply for admission at your selected schools and then apply for TE Scholarships. Application for admission and TE should be happening simultaneously so that all records match up and students can receive full consideration.
3. Create a Tuition Exchange account. The [TE application](#) is all about the student, so the student should use an email address besides their high school or parent employer's email. This account will stay with you throughout your TE journey.
4. The maximum number of active schools on your TE Application at any one time is 20. You can add or delete schools at any time. If you are no longer interested in a school, please remove them from your list so that the school knows you no longer wish to be considered for TE. Additionally, please notify the admissions office.
5. Once the export eligibility has been reviewed and confirmed by HR, the TE application(s) is certified and sent to the importing schools selected on the TE application.
6. At this point the Importing (schools your GW dependent is applying to) institutions take over the process.
7. Please make note of all the deadlines your import school set for when applications for Import are due by and any other requirements they may have for admission. Applicants should also file for FAFSA as soon as possible after October 1st. By filing FAFSA you may be eligible for additional need based financial assistance. If you demonstrate financial need, any federal or state financial assistance that you receive will be coordinated with TE if you are offered the scholarship. Each import institution can provide guidance when you receive your Financial Aid offer for how TE would be impacted.
